CISM Group and Individual Crisis Intervention (GRIN)

West Baton Rouge Parish Fire District #1

August 17 - 19, 2017

This 3-day CISM training combines ALL the content of ICISF's **Assisting Individuals in Crisis AND Group Crisis Intervention** courses.

Crisis Intervention is NOT psychotherapy; CISM is a specialized health intervention intended to mitigate the impacts of critical incident stress requiring specialized training.

As physical first aid is to surgery, crisis intervention is to psychotherapy. Crisis intervention is sometimes called "emotional first aid." This program is designed to present the core elements of Critical Incident Stress Management program that is comprehensive, integrated, systematic, and multimodal to serve the needs of victims and first responders alike.

The class will prepare participants to understand a wide range of crisis intervention options for both **individual** and **group** intervention. Participants will use role-play scenarios to apply and become comfortable with learning. The participants will leave with knowledge, skills and tools to provide several group interventions including:

- RITS (Rest Information Transition & Support)
- Crisis Management Briefings
- Defusings, and
- Critical Incident Stress Debriefing (CISD).

The participants will leave with knowledge, skills and tools to assess, select, and provide individual and group crisis interventions to a variety of situations.

Upon completion, you will receive two certificates from ICISF:

Group Crisis Intervention (with 14 contact hours)

Individual Crisis Intervention and Peer Support (with 13 contact hours)

Instructor for the class is Chaplain Dr. Edgar Hatcher of St Louis, MO. Ed is a retired USAF chaplain with a Doctorate in Pastoral Counseling; a Licensed Professional Counselor in MO, specializing in trauma, grief, and suicide prevention. He is a Board Certified Trauma Responder; having more than 1200 hours of specialized training in trauma ministry. An approved ICISF instructor for 16 courses, he also teaches classes in Psychological First Aid, Theodicy, and clergy response to sexual assault.
